March 11, 1934 - February 2, 2017

PRINCETON — Agnes Jean (Sprowls) Anderson passed away peacefully on Thursday, Feb. 2, 2017, at Liberty Village in Princeton.

Jean, as she was known, was born March 11, 1934, in Neponset to Richard and Gertrude Sprowls.

In 1952, she graduated from Sheffield Community Consolidated High School in Sheffield, where she was an active participant in school and local activities. Her many musical talents included playing the piano "by ear," playing drums in the high school band and orchestra, and singing in the choirs of the Sheffield and Princeton Methodist churches. Jean was athletic, playing on the local "Sassy Sals" softball team and frequently winning the women's course championship at Wyaton Hill Golf Course in Princeton.

She married William H. Halberg Sr. in 1957 and later married Thomas H. Anderson Jr. in 1977. She worked as a bookkeeper at Princeton High School from 1969 until her retirement in 1991. Later, she worked as a bookkeeper for Dimas in Princeton.

She is survived by her daughter, Sherry Halberg Kownacki of Normal; her son, William H. Halberg Jr. of Oglesby; and her stepdaughters, Sundra (Don) Edwards of Vero Beach, Fla., and Carla Anderson of Farmington. She is also survived by her brother, Bob (Ann) Sprowls of Sheffield; and her sister, Joyce (Tom) McLean of Desert Hot Springs, Calif.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, two brothers, five sisters and a stepdaughter, Marta Gasparovich.
