Berneice Brooks, age 100 of Princeton, passed away on Monday, Feb 09, 2009 at Colonial Rehab and Nursing Center. She donated her body to science. She attended college in Normal and later recieved her Bachelors Degree in Education in 1967. She taught in many rural one room school houses in the Bureau County area. She married Floyd Troyer in 1927, he died in 1928. She then married Russell Quickle, he died in 1953. She then married Roy Brooks in 1962, he died in 1990. She was a farm wife. After getting her degree she taught and worked at Spurgeons. After retiring from those positions she worked at Roosevelt Square and got her CNA certificate. She was a life-long member of Kasbeer Community Church where she taught Sunday School and Vacation Bible School, was in the Women's Bible Study group and sung in the choir. She was also involved with the Princeton Senior Center, was in the Sharps and Flats Kitchen Band,

was a member Bureau Co. Home Extension, and volunteered at Jefferson School.

She is survived by one son Tom Quickle of OK, and one daughter Barbara Kinnett of Hennepin. Also surviving are 12 grandchildren, 19 great-grandchildren, and 6 great-great-grandchildren. Surviving as well is one sister Margorie Schultz of Rockford.

She is preceded in death by her parents, husbands, one brother, one son John Quickle, and one son-in-law Larry Kinnett.
