He graduated from Cerro Coso Community College in 1988 with an Associates Degree in Arts, and then graduated in 1990 from California State University in Bakersfield, CA. with a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies. He then went on to graduate in 1993 from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, with a Master of Science in Elementary Education. Gary was enlisted in the U.S. Navy from 1974 to 1982 obtaining the rank of E-5. He achieved the ranking of Aircraft Electrician Petty Officer Second Class. Gary married Patricia Gregory in 1973. She preceded him in death. He later married Sheri Williams of Princeton. He

was a member of Modern Woodworkers of America and the First Lutheran Church of Princeton. He enjoyed traveling and was an avid woodworker turning bowls and pens in his garage, making urns and fixing wooden items for friends.
