Mr. Wilde passed away on Tuesday, Apr 15, 2008 at his home. He was born on May 08, 1929 in Quincy, Illinois to Herbert and Hazel (Valeu) Wilde. He graduated from Rantoul High School in 1947. He then graduated from the University of Illinois Business College in 1949. Ted joined the US Army in 1951 and served during Korean War until 1953. He married Judith Weigers on Oct. 25, 1958 in Marinette, WI, she survives. Ted first worked as a credit investigator for Dunn and Bradstreet and then worked for Central National Bank and Trust in Rockford, IL. He began working at First State Bank of Princeton on Feb. 1, 1967, and was President of Farmers State Bank of Sheffield during his time there. He retired as Sr. Vice President of First State Bank of Princeton in 1993. Ted was a Paul Harris Fellow Rotarian for 40 years. He was also a past Rotary President. He was a member of the

Princeton Chamber of Commerce and founder of Princeton Development Corp. He was an active member of St. Louis Catholic Church. He was a trustee at the church for years and the founder and first president of St. Louis Catholic School Foundation. Ted was a past member of the board of directors at Perry Memorial Hospital, the Knights of Columbus, and Bureau Valley Country Club. He was named Man of the Year for Rotary in 1987 and received the Retailer Ameritas award in 1996. Ted loved golfing and wintering in Florida with his wife to play golf. He also loved spending time with his grandchildren.

Ted is survived by his wife Judith of Princeton and their two children; H. Ted Wilde Jr. and his wife Terry of Chicago and Laura W. (Robert) Charland of Shorewood. Also surviving are five grandchildren; Emilee, Marlee, and Logan Wilde and Clay and Chad Charland. Surviving as well is one brother Benjamin Wilde of Columbus, Ga.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
