PRINCETON — Kendall Mark Frank, 59, of Princeton went to be with the Lord at 8:20 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 13, 2016, surrounded by family after battling cancer for more than a year.

Kendall was born March 31, 1956, the son of Gene and Mildred Frank. He married Janet Lynn Kenny July 8, 1978.

He grew up on the family farm off of Little Denmark near Princeton. He attended Princeton schools and graduated from Princeton High School in 1974. He started working part-time at Nelson's Grocery Store on the south end of Princeton.
