Bodie passed away on Sunday, Oct 05, 2008 at Kindred Hospital, Sycamore Il. He was born on Mar 17, 1931 in Harmon, Illinois to Oscar Smallwood and Genevieve O.(Burdge)Smallwood.

He graduated from Harmon High School in 1948 (for grades 9 to 11) and from Dixon High School in 1949 (12th grade). He attended Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington. He served in the US Army during the Korean War from 1951 - 1953. He married Bonnie Woolsey Nov. 28, 1953 at the Methodist church in Amboy. He then graduated from Worsham College of Mortuary Science in 1954.

Bodie became a licensed funeral director in the state of Illinois in 1954. In 1955 he began working in Princeton for Norberg Memorial Home. Then in 1959 he became a partner in Norberg's. In 2000 he became the sole owner of Norberg's until 2003 when he brought his son J.D. into partnership with him.

(Shannon) Smallwood of Princeton, and Terry (Julie) Smallwood of Princeton.
