Pamela Anne Grenier peacefully passed away on September 9, 2023 at OSF Richard Owens Hospice Home in Peoria with her family by her side. She was born in Princeton on February 5, 1941, the daughter of Phillip and Ella Batson. Pam and her older brother, Lowell, were both raised in Princeton, Illinois.

She married Virgil Bartman in 1956 and together they had 7 children, Cinthia (John) Zolper, Victoria (Tom) Schertz, Joseph (Mary) Bartman, Crystal (Bill) Vowels, Douglas (Veronica) Bartman, Elizabeth Bartman and Michael (Elise) Bartman. She could be found most days digging in her garden, planting new flowers and trees or birding. She enjoyed painting, sewing, playing cards, and teaching her grandchildren to play chess. It was not uncommon to catch Pamela with a crossword puzzle or a good book. She took local classes on plumbing and stained glasswork. She was handy with tools and was never afraid to tackle a home project. In fact, Pam personally renovated every room in her home.

She loved the company of dogs and cared for several of the neighborhood cats. Friends and family may remember her dogs Micki, Frannie, Lulu, and Marley. In her most recent years, it was not unusual to see Pamela walking her dogs alongside her scooter through Tiskilwa.
