Wyanet - Richard "Dick" LeRoy Hines, 82, of Wyanet, Illinois, passed away on Sunday, June 22, 2025, at OSF St. Anthony Medical Center in Rockford, IL surrounded by the people who loved him most-his devoted wife and daughters.

Born on March 6, 1943, at St. Joseph's Hospital in Joliet, Illinois, to LeRoy G. and Doris (Rish) Hines. Dick lived a life filled with love, laughter, and purpose. He was a man of deep faith and strong values. A dedicated member of the Wyanet United Methodist Church, a proud Mason, Scottish Rite and a Shriner. He was also an active supporter of the National Wild Turkey Federation and NRA, Dick lived with purpose and gave generously of his time and heart.

He was never happier than when he was outside, turkey hunting in the Spring sitting quietly in the woods, or during deer season in the Fall. You could find him casting a line into the Jack's Fork River or enjoying a good competitive game of pool. He also loved to swap stories over a good meal or a glass of Scotch. Eminence, Missouri, and New Orleans, Louisiana, both held a special place in his heart. Their favorite destinations, where he and Marty returned time and time again to soak in the atmosphere.

Above all, Dick loved his family. He was a dedicated husband, a proud father, grandpa and great grandpa and a loyal friend. He showed up with his whole heart, whether cheering someone on, offering a listening ear, or simply sharing a laugh. His legacy is one of love, adventure, and connection.
