Mr. Hoover passed away on Saturday, Apr 12, 2008 at his home. He was born on Aug 16, 1913 in Princeton, IL. to Walter and Maude (Dremann) Hoover. He graduated from Princeton High School in 1932. He married Doris Odell on August 15, 1937 in Princeton. She preceded him in death in 2001. Roger farmed in Bureau Twp. and in the Manlius area for many years. He served on the Bureau County Farm Board for many years. He was instrumental in establishing 4-H in Bureau County and was a leader in that organization for many years. Roger was also instrumental in getting electricity to rural areas by getting families to allow poles to be set on their property. He served on the Bureau Twp. Grade School Board for many years and was also their president for several terms. He was an active member of St. Matthews Lutheran Church and is their oldest living baptized member. Roger was a volunteer driver for

Meals on Wheels and also drove a delivery van for Wyanet Locker. He worked on the Wyanet Village Crew, was the Wyanet Twp. Assessor, and he helped start the Wyanet Rescue Unit.
