Suzanne (More) Neher was born in Chicago Dec. 6, 1930 to David Thurber More and Pearl Katherine (Uthoff) More. She died April 5, 2011 in Princeton. She spent her early years in Midlothian in the home her father built, later moving to LaGrange. Sue graduated from Lyons Township High School in 1948. She married Theodore Valentine Neher Jr. July 8, 1951. They later divorced and Sue moved to her much-loved family home in Princeton, where she proudly remained until her death.

When her children were young, she worked a variety of jobs including babysitting, dog grooming and ironing. Later she worked at Champion Pneumatic and Pioneer Seed.

Sue was an avid reader, gardener, knitter, cook and baker. Her cinnamon rolls were the best.

She would take on any task, including restoring her home and upholstering furniture. She took the resources available and made grape jelly and pear preserves from the bounty of her own yard. She helped with Boy Scouts and Campfire Girls, volunteered at her church, Hampshire Colony Congregational Church and was always ready and willing to help others. Throughout her life, she sacrificed her wants and needs for the sake of her children.

Sue was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis in the 1980s. She faced the disease with supreme courage and grace.

Sue is survived by her children: Theodore Valentine Neher III and wife Diana, David Talbot Neher, and Rebecca Sue Neher Beach and husband Joe. Also surviving are grandchildren Hilary Neher Gibson, Cassie Neher (Daniel) Bruhn, Juliann Neher (Kirk) Francis, Jessica Beach and Jake Beach as well as a greatgranddaughter Karalynn Bruhn.

A sister, Mary Zdenek and nieces Cathy (Nick) Cindrich, Connie and Sue, also survive.
