Princeton – Timothy C. Elliott, 56, of Princeton, IL passed away on Sunday, June 24, 2018 in Pennsylvania.

“ One day last year I was riding along on that winding bottom road north and west of Tiskilwa that crosses the same railroad tracks twice in about a mile. I was heading east, and as I went over the first crossing, there was a stopped train strung out ahead of me. I came to the second crossing and sure enough, the train was blocking it. I said "Shit" at a conversational volume and clicked out of a pedal. From the other side of the train, I hear someone say, "This sucks, doesn't it!" Next thing I know, there's Tim stuffing his Bianchi up, over, and through the gap between two of the railroad cars with him climbing along right behind. For a split second, I had actually debated going UNDER one of the cars, but Tim saved me from that riskiness I know my wife wouldn't have approved of. So, I turned around and we rode together for a while. He told me how he was just getting back into riding after blowing out an achilles tendon while (of all things) RUNNING. Anyway, as we're spinning along and he's telling me this story, I'm thinking about how, even while recovering from that injury, he was still a stronger rider than I am. I say "still" because I also rode with him a few times back in his first year of cycling. I've been riding for over 30 years, and in his first year as a cyclist, Tim was stronger than me. He was a natural on a bike.
