



Virginia C. Bundt

November 20, 1922 - August 16, 2011

PRINCETON — Virginia (Miller) Bundt, 88, passed away at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 16, 2011. She had been a resident of Liberty Village of Princeton since August of 2007.

Virginia Catherine (Miller) Bundt was born Nov. 20, 1922, on a farmstead near Annawan to Fred and Dorothy (Lambert) Miller. She is survived by her sister, Roberta June Lange, and brother, Loren Miller, both residents at Liberty Village of Princeton. Also surviving are her sister, Lorna Wyatt of Oklahoma, and a very special care advocate and loving niece, Carol Whittington of Geneva, along with several nieces and nephews.

Virginia graduated from Manlius High School in 1940. She enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II (1944-1949). She held the rank of Telegrapher-Third Class. Following service to her country, she moved to Chicago and worked at A.B. Dick Company for more than 34 years.

She now resides in the comfort and peace with her maker and those who have gone before, her father, mother and her brother, David. She will also follow her twin sister, who passed just six months ago. She and her sister,

Vivian, spent their entire life together through birth. Though born twins, they were actually born 10 hours apart, giving them separate birth dates. They entered the Navy together and after their honorable discharge they both moved to Chicago. Both found jobs and lived together. Vivian re-enlisted and Virginia did not, this was the only time spent apart. They later purchased a home together and retired together. They both relocated to Liberty Village in Princeton to live out their days together as roommates.

A remembrance and prayer service will be at 11:30 a.m. Saturday in the Norberg Memorial Home, Princeton. A time of gathering to celebrate her life will be 30 minutes prior to the time of service.

Cremation rites have been accorded. Virginia and Vivian will be laid to rest together at Elm Lawn Cemetery following the service. There will be a military farewell salute for their service.
