PRINCETON – William B. Moreland, age 90, passed away at home Monday March 30, 2015. A Funeral Service will be Friday April 3, 2015 at 10:00 AM at Christ Community Church in Princeton. Pastor Gary Sinclair will officiate. The family will receive friends during a visitation April 2, 2015 from 4:00 to 8:00 PM at Norberg Memorial Home, Princeton. Burial will be at Elm Lawn Memorial Park in Princeton.

Bill was born on December 20, 1924 to Bon and Effie (Hill) Moreland in Ramsey, IL. He married Oneida Halford on April 29, 1945. Bill and Oneida joined the First Baptist Church in 1950 where he served as Deacon for six years and a trustee until 2004. He became a member of the Christian Motorcycle Club in August of 1999. He served as a 4-H leader for 17 years and as a Cub Scout leader for two years.

Bill farmed for 47 years starting in 1946 until he retired in 1994. He joined the Farm Bureau in 1946 and served as a director for several years. He was a big supporter of Ethanol and was the first farmer to take delivery in Bureau Co. Bill and a neighbor were responsible for keeping 13 railroad crossing open in Bureau Co.

Bill is survived by his wife Oneida, and three sons, Gary (Janet) Moreland and David (Barb) Moreland both of Princeton, and Roger (Peggy) Moreland of Owattona, MN. Also surviving are eight grandchildren, and eleven great-grandchildren, one sister Gertie Spires of Princeton and three brothers Donald of Henry IL, Claude of Aledo IL, and Everett of Kings IL.

He was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers Warren Denver in infancy, John of Erie KS, Bob of Brighton CO and one sister Geneva Hicks of Amboy, IL.
